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CAR OF THE MONTH

This is Paul O' Toole's gorgeous 1968 Bonneville convertible. He acquired this beauty in May 2021 from the estate of Ned Anello, a long time Yankee Chapter member. After Ned's passing, his wife Paula began to look for new caretakers. It was at this time that Paul was able to view the car. It was love at first sight and he was honored to take stewardship and appreciated Paula's trust in him to take care of Ned's beloved Bonneville. Along with the standard equipment, options include custom air conditioning, power windows, Soft Ray glass in all windows, cornering lamps, outside rear view mirror, AM radio with power antenna, rear speaker, door edge guards, and Rally II wheels. Color is a stunning Solar Red (Code R) with black convertible top and interior. Under the hood you'll find a 400 cube, 340 horse motor mated to a Turbo-Hydramatic transmission.

Paul's Bonneville was an early build from the Linden NJ plant in October 1967. It was then shipped to Cerami Pontiac in nearby Ridgewood, NJ. It's one of 7,358 Bonneville drop tops built for 1968. In addition to this fine red convertible, Paul also owns a 1968 Bonneville 4 door in Verdoro green parchment interior and white vinyl top. Paul's owned several Pontiacs over the decades and they are all special but this Solar red beauty is unique. Paul has a deep connection with this car in large part due to its history.







Tech Talk - Repro Rochester Carb Top Plate By Dan Hurley

Ames Performance and **pontiactripower.com** offer complete replacement top plates for Rochester "2-Jet" carbs as installed for front or rear units on 1959-66 Tri-power assemblies. We all want to

keep our original parts, but when you discover that a fuel line fitting was attached with epoxy to stripped threads, plus the corner mounting ear is cracked and also fixed with epoxy, you begin to think about the advantages of fresh metal. The price for a Rochester "2-Jet" top plate is \$92 and it arrived from Spofford, NH the very next day. The finish of the replacement plate is considered authentic although the color is unlikely to exactly match the aged appearance of your existing units. You'll be able to pick out the new part on the rear carb in the photo. Ames notes that the reproduction plate is stamped correctly, but that the "GM" logo is upside down. Interestingly, the "GM" logo on our original plate faces the same direction as the new unit, although the original logo is inside a circle that is not included in the reproduction.

The plate includes an installed lever for the accelerator pump, although Ames warns that the lever may fit loosely and they offer a \$4.00 brass bushing that can be used to improve the fit. On our unit, the lever actually fit too tightly and we did not use the bushing. Instead, we spent time working the lever loose. Ames also warns that the accelerator pump's inner lever may fit loosely into the top plate lever, and they offer another \$4.00 part to improve that fit. Our accelerator pump inner lever was again almost too tight and we did not use the part. And finally, Ames offers excellent replacement brass fuel line fittings that are correct for the front, center, and rear carburetor. The reproduction plate was a tiny bit thicker at the air horn wall and would not fit over the original screws that mount the venturi cluster in the main carburetor body (visible in the photograph looking into the bore). A little patience with the Dremel tool created the necessary clearance and the plate then installed nicely. The fuel lines and mounting screws matched well and the installation was leak-free. The completed assembly has now worked properly during the course of several drives over a few weeks. In the end, 92 bucks seems like a solid deal for the opportunity to get some epoxy out of the tri-power set-up. The reproduction plate might also be an option to keep your car on the road while you work out permanent repairs to your original plate.
