


#### CAR OF THE MONTH

Joseph Esposito was born in 1906. He became a mechanic at a very young age and wrenched on Model T's when they were new. Joe found gainful employment over the decades at several dealerships and service stations throughout Brooklyn New York. He had quite a reputation as an expert mechanic rebuilding engines and transmissions in addition all other automotive repairs. Joe knew about servicing all makes and models. Fast forward to April 1962, he went out to purchase a new car. He's had all types of vehicles over the years but had his eyes set on the *new* for '62 Pontiacs. Interestingly, Joe had never owned a Pontiac. He drove down to Rogers Pontiac at 60th and Fort Hamilton Parkway in Brooklyn. Rogers was an established Pontiac and Studebaker dealership and one of the largest in the area. Joe had initial interest in the Bonneville but because it wasn't available in a sedan post body, he went with the Star Chief. The post was an important feature for Joe as he felt it added rigidity to the body and was thus safer in case of an accident or rollover. Focusing on the Star Chief, Joe knew exactly what he wanted and placed the order. Caravan Gold exterior and bench seat interior, 389 engine with the economical 2 bbl carb and 4 speed Super-Hydamatic transmission. Not much else except the AM radio and 14" whitewall tires with hubcaps. The car came without seatbelts and without power anything. Joe took possession 8 weeks later when his car arrived at the dealership from the nearby Linden NJ plant. Joe babied that car. He kept it at a nearby garage so it was protected from bad weather and he only drove it on weekends, holidays and family trips. It was a wonderful car that his kids Marilyn and Eddie fondly remember to this day. Sadly, Joe passed away in 1971 and his beloved Star Chief was given to his son Eddie with only 13k miles on the odometer. Eddie maintained stewardship until 2018. He did a lot of work on the car to keep it road worthy. To Eddie, it was more than a car, it was a remembrance of his dear father. In 2015 it became difficult to keep up with servicing the Star Chief and he and his sister Marilyn begrudgingly began to seek out a good home for it. Enter Yankee Chapter member Marty Covais who lives in nearby Long Island and owns a 1962 Catalina which he inherited from his father in 1975. Marty has a soft spot for any '62 Pontiac full size so he took possession of the Esposito's Star Chief. Eddie said it was like giving up a child when he handed over the keys but knew it was going to a good home. After a few days, Marty realized that he was unable to properly store the car but he was able to find the perfect home and the Star Chief was sent to Club member Tom Tupka. In an interesting twist of fate, Tom had to sell his own 1962 4 door Star Chief in 1970 when he went into the Army. It was a move Tom regretted for almost 50 years. He was thrilled to acquire this very original car. Tom takes the Star Chief to shows all over the northeast. Although there's been some modifications, the car is amazingly original. I think Joe would be very pleased to know that his prized Star Chief is being taken care of and enjoyed by the Tupka family and others they meet on the road. I would like to thank Marilyn Esposito and Eddie Esposito for sharing this wonderful story of their father's car.


### **Otter Creek Speedway - Vergennes Vermont**

This particular pace car was supplied by Vergennes Pontiac.

Otter Creek was briefly a NASCAR sanctioned track that opened in 1961. "Hi Monroe" was the owner of the track and the farmland on which it was built on. The track closed in 1971.





