Dom Persampieri acquired his beautiful 1976 Trans Am way back in 1982. Built in the Norwood OH plant, this vehicle was then shipped to Damon Pontiac in Abington, MA. This is a very well optioned car that had a sticker price for over \$7,000 (\$39,000 in 2025 dollars.) There are many features to Dom's '76 T/A not the least if which is the potent 455 engine with 4 barrel carb, 4 speed manual transmission and a 3:53 rear end. That would be enough for most enthusiasts, but Dom's car has a lot of added goodies. Other options include power windows, air conditioning, tilt steering wheel, AM/FM radio with 8 track player, 70x15 steel belted radial tires on gold honeycomb rims, soft ray glass, front & rear floor mats, gold interior & exterior appointments, gold stripping, decals and badging. This T/A has the *Special Edition Package*, the *Custom Trim Package* and the *Lamp Group Package*. All those packages wrapped into one hot ride. Dom takes his Trans Am all over the the area. It's a must stop and see at any show he is attending.

Before the gas crisis sank demand for gas guzzling V8's.

Before federal regulations could fully strangle the muscle car era.

A time when Pontiac Motor Division was still stamping dreams out of steel.

Cars such as the Trans Am, the special top tier Firebird, introduced in 1969, returning this year with it's legendary shaker hook and 455 ci (7.4 liter) V8.

There was The Judge- the special high performance GTO, returning one final time, or GT-37, the under cover GTO that offered all of its big brother's performance, without (initially) the ire of insurance companies. And of course, the introduction of a totally new Pontiac: Grand Ville- the full sized luxury car aimed at snagging sales from the competition. The ultimate expression of Pontiac luxury, supported on the sales floor by strong foot traffic from Bonneville and Catalina owners.

For those who felt even Grand Ville wasn't distinctive enough, Pontiac offered the Grand Prix, their personal luxury coupe that the Wide Track people brazenly called the first new car to start out as a classic. This was the zenith of Pontiac- their high water mark- a company that would let you order a 400 or 455 CI V8 in just about anything. One that offered stick shift Grand Prix's and variable ratio power steering. Or as their 1971 tag line said: "Pure Pontiac".

Over the following decade, buyers would be dismayed as Pontiacs started showing up in US showrooms with V8 engines made by other divisions. The legendary GTO was retired as was the 455. Grand Ville disappeared after '75. A decade later, Catalina would depart as Bonneville moved to a smaller (G) chassis. These yellow pages remind us that once upon a time, there was an automaker bringing American performance to the masses. Cars within reach for the average person, yet offering legitimate bragging rights- cars that lived up to the promise of their name.

Long before plastic cladding. Long before the Korean built LeMans.

Or corporate engineering. Why was your granddad so disappointed in those 80's cars? Because he remembered these. Pontiac engines in Pontiac cars, built in Pontiac.





